

The Field Estuary

Parking lot and trailhead are on the right 0.2 mile from the start of Wolfe's Neck Road. The trail forks shortly into two out and back trails; either way it is about 0.8 mile from the trailhead to the end. Both the Over the Hills Trail and the Bear Caves Trail have a fair amount of up and down. Highlights are the dramatic terrain in the woods and marsh views at the end of both trails.



Brewer Woods

Trailhead is on Flying Point Road 0.7 miles east of the intersection with Wolfe's Neck Road. Parking lot and trailhead sign are on right ride of road when heading east. The trail goes next to a driveway and then in the woods. After the trail crosses a small bridge the trail divides and makes a short loop. Along one side of the trail are the upper reaches of the Little River's tidal waters. A round trip walk on the trail is about 0.7 mile.



Wolfe's Neck Center

Trails start from different places along Burnett Road.

- Farm Loop Trail: signs on the Deer Run Trail, Little River Trail and Recompense Campground Trail refer to the FLT, or Farm Loop Trail, indicating that all these trails are part of a connected 3-mile loop of the farm, though at times you will be on a dirt road.
- Deer Run Trail: this .8-mile trail begins on Burnett Road towards Flying Point Road. At about .1 mile, the trail forks left (if you go straight, you will



be on an older trail). The trail crosses a small stream, eventually following along the Little River. Just after you come to a circular outdoor classroom, you will connect to the Little River Trail.

- Little River Trail: this trail offers several short loops and connects to the Deer Run Trail. The outside trail follows the Little River. The inner loops are perfect short hikes for kids. The trail begins behind the main farm house.
- Discovery Trail: this .3-mile trail begins behind the main farm house and leads to the milking building. The trail ends at the farm café on Burnett Road.



- Recompense Campground Trail: This .5-mile trail connects the East Bay and West Bay sections of the campground. It winds through the woods and across a stream, with a spot to stop and view the bay.
- Quiet Cove Trail: This .25-mile trail offers a quick out and back to the water and is often not crowded when the farm trails are busy.

Rachel's Cove

Trailhead is on the right side of Wolfe's Neck Road about 2.5 miles from the beginning of the road, about 0.6 mile past the entrance to the state park. Parking is on the road. This very short trail quickly divides and makes a loop down to the Harraseeket shore, about 0.2 mile round trip. There are nice water views especially in afternoon light.



Wolfe's Neck Woods State Park

Find the entrance to the state park 2.1 miles down Wolfe's Neck Road. The park charges an entrance fee. In the parking lot, there are maps of the trail system, including Casco Bay Trail with ocean views and osprey sightings and the longer Harraseeket Trail with western, harbor views, and many other trails in between.
